Spotlight on immigrant filmmakers at the Hawai'i International Film Festival: New American Perspectives

Presented by the Vilcek Foundation, New American Perspectives includes film screenings, talks, and a free panel discussion open to the public centering immigrant artists and filmmakers.

HONOLULU—September 26, 2024—The Vilcek Foundation is partnering with the Hawai'i International Film Festival (HIFF) to present New American Perspectives at the HIFF44, taking place October 2–13 in Honolulu, HI. Presented as part of the festival's featured offerings, New American Perspectives centers a select group of immigrant filmmakers and their work through film screenings, filmmaker Q&As, a panel discussion, and artist presentations open to the public.

New American Perspectives embodies the Vilcek Foundation's mission to raise awareness of immigrant contributions in the United States and fosters appreciation for the arts and sciences by recognizing and celebrating the cultural contributions of immigrants. The program was established in 2007 in partnership with HIFF, honoring the festival's vision of supporting independent, foreign-born, and indigenous filmmakers, with a focus on artists from the Pacific Rim.

At the 2024 festival, the Vilcek Foundation and HIFF are delighted to host Academy Award—winning cinematographer Roger Deakins (b. United Kingdom) and his partner, editor and script supervisor James Ellis Deakins. The 2024 New American Perspectives cohort also includes documentary filmmaker Ramona S. Diaz (b. Philippines), director Sasha Rainbow (b. New Zealand), artist, curator, and filmmaker Van Tran Nguyen (b. Vietnam), and director Kenji Tsukamoto (b. Japan). All six filmmakers will participate in a panel discussion centering their voices and experiences hosted by the Vilcek Foundation and HIFF on Sunday, October 6.

"Immigration and migration are a vital part of the American story," says Vilcek Foundation President Rick Kinsel. "Through the lens of film, New American Perspectives invites viewers to explore diverse narratives that reflect the immigrant experience—both through the stories told on screen, and the experiences of the filmmakers themselves."

He continues, "By creating this platform for immigrant artists' voices, we build greater recognition of the multiplicity of immigrant and migration stories that are part of the fabric of the United States. This diversity is a vital part of our collective identity."

HIFF Executive Director Beckie Stocchetti reflected on the program. "At the center of our work at HIFF, we aim to connect with project partners whose values mirror our own: To empower filmmakers and artists with meaningful support and opportunities, and to make film accessible to the public. New American Perspectives accomplishes this, while building visibility for emerging and leading immigrant filmmakers."

She adds, "Through HIFF's education programs, we are also able to bring these filmmakers to present talks and programs at schools in Hawai'i, providing students with powerful and diverse role models."

Tran Nguyen's first full-length feature, *The Motherload*, explores the experiences of a Vietnamese American mother and daughter as they navigate their relationships to one another, the United States, and Vietnam. With sharp satire, wit, cardboard helicopters, and puppets, the film deflates the militaristic propaganda and misinformation about the American war in Vietnam that has driven and been perpetuated by Hollywood films from *The Green Berets* to *Apocalypse Now*.
